**Developments for Release on
Tuesday, 28th July 2015**

DISH 22.0

On 1st July 2015, the following BSPs switched to DISH version 22: BW, IN, MW, MZ, ZA, ZM, ZW. Consequently, all transactions are reported and files are generated in the new format.

On 1st August 2015, BSP JP will switch to DISH 22 and on 31st August the following BSPs will also switch to the new DISH version: FJ, GU, TO and WS.

PCI Password Management: Implementation on EC and AA

On 20th July the PCI management policy has been activated in BSP EC and AA in order to strengthen the BSPlink management policy and secure sections of the BSPlink application.

Future Developments

BSPlink Integration with IATA's Customer Portal

Preparation phase: BSPlink application will be modified in order to collect users' email addresses which will be used at a later stage by IATA's Portal Team to create Portal Users. To this end, BSPlink users will be asked to provide and validate an email address upon logging into BSPlink. This email will be stored and linked to that particular BSPlink user.

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Ticketing Authority DEL files for Ticketing Authority Synchronisation

The current format of the GDS "Delete File for Non-TA Records" will now include one DEL action per active agent and all the active airlines which are not present in the CIP table. The IATA "95" airlines codes will be excluded when generating this file.

Ticketing Authority Files Frequency Increase

On 15th July 2015 at 01:00 CET, the frequency of the transmission of the automated Ticketing Authority files was increased from every 2 hours (12 files per day) to every hour (24 files per day).

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
